

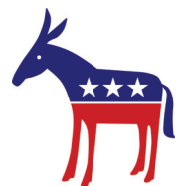
Election Authority's Notice of Primary Election

The following are candidates for nomination to be voted for at the Primary Election to be held in the County of Texas, State of Missouri, on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in August 2014, being the fifth day of August, 2014, who have filed in the offices of Jason Kander, Secretary of State, or Donald R. Troutman, County Clerk and Texas County Election Authority, written declarations of candidacy as candidates for nomination, and are entitled to be voted for at such primary as required by law. The Primary Election will be held at the 10 voting districts within the County of Texas, and polling locations (voting districts) will be open between the hours of 6 o'clock in the morning and 7 o'clock in the evening. The absentee voting process will remain unchanged. Any person properly registered to vote in the county will be given the opportunity to cast his/her ballot.

The following are the locations of the county's vote districts along with the names of the county's precincts that will be voting in these locations: **Licking**, Fox Fire Station-Community Room, 115 Old Salem Rd., Licking, Boone, Lynch II and Sherrill; **Raymondville**, Raymondville School gym, 135 W. Highway B, Raymondville, Jackson and Ozark; **Summersville**, Summersville High School old gym, 525 Rogers Ave., Summersville, Carroll, Current and Date; **Houston**, Houston Storm Shelter, 191 N. First St. (Pine Street entrance), Houston, Piney and Cass II; **Cabool**, Cabool High School gym (new gym), 1020 Garst Ave., Cabool, Burdine, Cass I and Sargent; **Dunn**, Mountain Grove Mission, 10410 E. Bus 60, Mountain Grove, Clinton; **Success**, Success School gym, 10341 Hwy. 17, Success, Lynch I and Upton I; **Roby**, Citizens Center-Northwest Texas County, 12274 Highway 32, Roby, Roubidoux I and Roubidoux II; **Fairview**, Fairview Pentecostal Church, 6584 Highway M, Cabool, Morris and Upton II; and **Clear Springs**, Clear Springs Community Building, 1998 Bradford Rd., Willow Springs, Pierce.

Proposed by the 97th General Assembly (First Regular Session) CCS No. 2 SS HCS HJR Nos. 11 & 7

Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to ensure that the right of Missouri citizens to engage in agricultural production and ranching practices shall not be infringed?

The potential costs or savings to governmental entities are unknown, but likely limited unless the resolution leads to increased litigation costs and/or the loss of federal funding.

Constitutional Amendment No. 5
Proposed by the 97th General Assembly (Second Regular Session) SCS SJR No. 36

State and local governmental entities should have no direct costs or savings from this proposal. However, the proposal's passage will likely lead to increased litigation and criminal justice related costs. The total potential costs are unknown, but could be significant.

Constitutional Amendment No. 7
Proposed by the 97th General Assembly (Second Regular Session) SS HJR No. 68

Should the Missouri Constitution be changed to enact a temporary sales tax of three-quarters of one percent to fund state and local highway, roads, bridges and transportation projects for 10 years, with priority given to repairing unsafe roads and bridges?

This change is expected to produce \$480 million annually to the state's Transportation Safety and Job Creation Fund and \$54 million for local governments. Increases in the gas tax will be prohibited. This revenue shall only be used for transportation purposes and cannot be diverted for other uses.

The annual cost or savings to state and local governmental entities is unknown, but likely minimal. If sales of a veterans lottery ticket game decreased existing lottery ticket sales, the profits of which fund education, there could be a small annual shift in funding from education to veterans' programs.

Proposition 1

Shall the township board of Burdine Township be authorized to increase the tax levy for road and bridge purposes by \$0.1866 cents on one hundred dollars assessed valuation?

If this proposition is approved by the voters, the total levy for Burdine Township road and bridge purposes will be \$0.50 cents per one hundred dollars of the current assessed valuation — 2013 assessed valuation - \$30,694,904. — 2013 revenue with a \$0.3134 road and bridge levy - \$96,197.82. — 2014 revenue with a \$0.5000 road and bridge levy - \$153,474.52 (based on the same assessed valuations).
